



SOP for Payment and Shipping in WooCommerce

Procedure:

Configuring Payment Gateways

- Step 1: Log into the WordPress admin dashboard and navigate to "WooCommerce" > "Settings" > "Payments."
- Step 2: Review the list of available payment gateways. WooCommerce comes with several default options like PayPal, Stripe, and Direct Bank Transfer. Click "Set up" or "Manage" next to a gateway to configure it.
